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AUGUSTA UNIVERSITY KATHERINE REESE PAMPLIN COLLEGE OF ARTS, HUMANITIES, AND SOCIAL SCIENCES and GEORGIA MILITARY COLLEGE TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

Agreement in Principle

This agreement formally recognizes that Augusta University's Katherine Reese Pamplin College of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences and Georgia Military College (GMC) are committed to the establishment of an educational partnership to better serve currently enrolled and future students at both institutions. Both parties agree to exercise due diligence in providing as smooth a transition as possible for students who elect to transfer to Augusta University's Pamplin College's Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) program from GMC.

Agreement on Accreditation

This agreement is contingent upon the continuation of all appropriate program and institutional accreditations, including the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) and those from professional bodies.

Agreement on Admission to BSW Program

Any GMC student who graduates from Georgia Military College with an Associate of Arts or Science in Social Work (as seen in Appendix A of this document) is eligible for admission into Augusta University's BSW program provided that the student has met the following requirements:

- Earned a minimum GPA of 2.5 out of a 4.0 scale for all college course work attempted
- Submitted all required materials within the appropriate deadlines
- Submitted an application to Augusta University with the required application fee and be admitted.
- Submitted an application to Augusta University's BSW program and be admitted by the Social Work faculty to the institution's BSW program

The student's eligibility of admission pertains only to Augusta University's Pamplin College. The student must then be accepted into Pamplin College's BSW program.

Agreement on Acceptance of Transfer Credit

The transfer credit evaluation is completed as part of the AU admission's decision process. Prior to acceptance, transcripts from all institutions attended must be on file. The Office of Academic Admissions completes the evaluation, and a notification is sent to the student indicating specifically how transfer credits are awarded.

Augusta University accepts transfer credit in accordance with the policies, rules and practices of the University System of Georgia, SACSCOC and its mission as a comprehensive state institution. The Augusta University course equivalency is determined by the Office of Academic Admissions in collaboration with academic departments and is based on criteria such as course content, course outcomes and the level at which the course is taught. There is no guarantee that courses transferred from other institutions will be accepted at Augusta University.

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Transfers from Georgia Military College with an Associate of Science (AS) in Social Work degree will transfer into Augusta University with the Core completed if they also completed two additional Area F (AU core) courses and the required COMM 1110 (AU)/COM 201 (GMC) course (if not taken in Area C at GMC) <u>or</u> a Humanities course (if the student takes COM 201 to fulfill the GMC core). Transfers from Georgia Military College with an Associate of Arts (AA) in Social Work degree will transfer into Augusta University with the Core completed if they also complete the required COMM 1110 course (COM 201 at GMC) as well as an additional Humanities course. Students who have not completed core or pre-requisites for admission to specific majors or programs of study at Augusta University will be required to complete them before being considered for admission into a specific major or program of study. Georgia Military College transfer students may complete such requirements at Augusta University.

GMC transfers will need to earn a grade of C or better in SOC 200, SOC 205, SWK 101, and SWK 150 for the course to count toward the BSW degree at Augusta University. GMC transfers will need to earn a grade of B or better in SWK 200 for the course to count toward the BSW degree at Augusta University.

Agreement on Communication

Augusta University's Pamplin College and Georgia Military College agree to cooperate in the publication and promotion of the articulation agreement between the two schools. Both parties will facilitate the dissemination of information about this program to interested and qualified students, with both institutions providing counseling and advisement.

Agreement on Maintenance and Review

At least one administrator or faculty member from each institution will be appointed to act as a primary point of contact and agent for the implementation of this agreement, to speak for the institutions, and to communicate details and modifications to respective faculty members, advisors, counselors, and others to whom the information is pertinent. Responsibility for oversight of this agreement rests with the Associate Chief Academic Officer at Georgia Military College and the Vice President of Enrollment and Student Affairs at Augusta University.

This agreement is open to all Georgia Military College students regardless of race, color, religion, gender, age, creed, national origin or disability. Review and communication of degree content changes will be completed on an annual basis. Additional degrees may be added to this agreement upon formal request. This agreement will be automatically renewed unless one of the parties notifies the other of its desire to terminate the agreement. Such notification must be in writing and submitted six months in advance with the effective date to coincide with the last day of the academic term under which it falls.

The conditions of the Transfer Articulation Agreement are subject to change as admissions requirements and policies change.
